# CAN I INFLUENCE THE LEGISLATURE???? THE ANSWER IS. . .YES! HOW????

The legislature has finished its multiple sessions, BUT OUR WORK IS NOT DONE! A KEY GOAL OF WSSRA AND UNIT 21 is to represent the interests of the active and retired school personnel to the state legislature. It is important that EACH of the 18,000+ members of WSSRA contact their representative between sessions.

#### THAT MEANS YOU AND ME!!!!

Five goals were presented to our membership. They are *critically important* to us in our retirement.

- 1. Maintain the PEBB health subsidy--this was part of the biennium budget and has been kept.
- 2. Oppose change to the pension plans--A defined contribution retirement system will hurt the state's ability to attract and keep highly qualified professional educators.
- 3. Make the actuarially recommended payment to the state pension funds. Plan 1 pension fund is underfunded due to past legislatures having skipped payments by the state.
- 4. RESTORE PLAN 1 COLA-Plan 1 retirees have not received a COLA since 2011. This has severely affected retirees.
- 5. ALLOW RETIREES TO SUBSTITUTE TEACH--Many retirees in Plan 2 and 3 are restricted from government employment until age 65. Allowing retirees to work part-time in schools would reduce the current substitute teacher shortage.

HOW TO EXPRESS YOUR CONCERNS TO YOUR LEGISLATOR. This is where we have must contact legislators and tell them how passing these goals would help us. The legislators RESPOND to their constituents. The BEST time to contact them is NOW between session by e-mail, letter, and phone.

#### 

- 1. Give contact information including email and legislative district.
- 2. Refer to proposed legislation or bill number if possible.
- 3. Describe pros and cons of legislation
- 4. Describe how you are personally affected by legislation
- 5. Request specific action clearly.
