# End of Year President's Report

It has been a busy and productive year for our WSSRA Unit 21. Your board started off the year with the yearly retreat/planning meeting last August and then after updating our Unit By-laws, accomplished to following this year:

- Diane Visten planned the Holiday Luncheon for December 2017 at the Skagit Golf and Country Club. We were treated to great Gaelic music for entertainment and speeches from our State Executive Director, Alan Burke and our current president Curt Horne. Over 100 pounds of non-perishables were donated by attendees. The nonperishables were delivered to the Skagit Valley Food Bank by Reider and Millie Ytgard. An auction was also held to benefit our mini-grant and scholarship programs.
- Joyce Moon led our Mini-grant Committee which awarded 25 \$100 grants to educators in our region to enable them to do something above and beyond with their students
- We sent three people to work in conjunction with the WSSRA State Legislative Committee in Olympia in January and March. With your emails, letters and phone calls to our legislators they helped us get a COLA and health care benefit increase for the first time since 2011.
- Lonnie Keown once again planned and scheduled the retirement seminar for current PERS and TRS members. The speakers from the State Retirement System were knowledgeable and took time to make sure everyone's questions were answered. If you know of current educators, you might want to remind them of this benefit we provide.
- We held a general membership meeting in April with Liz Jennings from Community Action of Skagit County as our presenter. She shared with us the results of the recently completed community needs assessment. She presented a good overall picture of what it takes to have secure housing, adequate food and medical care in our region. She included a description of how her organization helps to make that happen. Another 100 pounds of non-perishables were donated for the local food banks at that meeting. Toiletries were also donated and delivered to the Friendship House in Mount Vernon.
- We met our current \$1500 Western Washington University Scholarship Award winner, Allison Rosenburg (a Sedro Woolley High School graduate), and are working with WWU to determine our scholarship winner for this spring.
- In addition to having three Unit 21 members on the Legislative Committee this year, Unit 21 will have three members working on different WSSRA State Committees this upcoming year. Barbara Robinson has been selected to work on the Membership Committee, Diane Visten will again be on the State Legislative Committee, and Bruce Boyer will serve on the Finance Committee. It is unusual to have so many unit members serving on State Committees and reflects on how committed these members are. This coming year, Joanne Jones will chair the NW 1 Coordinating Council meeting which is comprised of the units from the Canadian border to northern King County. Also it should be noted that we have two members who are past WSSRA State Presidents. They are Eloise Stendal and Barbara Landrock. Our unit has a deep history of active members and will be looking for more members to help with our joint needs, especially at the local level. You have heard the phrase "many hands make for light work" and this is true for our organization too.
- Several of our members will be attending the WSSRA State Convention this June in Wenatchee. A synopsis will be shared with you in our Fall newsletter.
- Plans are underway for a candidate forum this coming June 30 at 1:00 pm at the Burlington Public Library. All candidates from our local legislative districts have been invited to give a short speech and then take questions from the audience. It will be important to have a good many of our members and friends attend to demonstrate our numbers and resolve for a continued COLA, increased health benefits and the state adequately funding our TRES and PERS retirement systems. Please put this time and date on your calendar and we hope to see you there. See the invitation to this event on the front page of this edition of your newsletter.

## **Dollars for Scholars**

Unit 21 has many things to celebrate and has shared its good luck with others this year. In our goal to support and help the educational process for all, students, teachers, and all other school employees we have three major activities.

#### <u>Mini Grant Program</u>

This program usually starts our year and takes place during September and October. In early Fall the notice and appropriate application forms are sent to all School Superintendents in our service area. They forward the message to their staff and the race is on. All awards are made on a first come-first served basis with WSSRA Unit 21 members being prioritized over nonmembers. This year we received 64 applications of which we funded 25. Applications (representing thirteen school districts) submitted were from all levels of the educational system. Requests varied from special equipment for special needs students to computer program materials, to shop equipment to funding treats for parent meetings. Each of the winning applications received \$25 to help meet these needs.

#### Western Washington University Scholarship

Unit 21 has worked with WWU to establish a scholarship of \$1500 per year for a student who is about to enter the student teaching phase of their training. Diane Visten who heads this program works with WWU to select a student who meets the qualifications that Unit 21 established when we first arranged for the scholarship to be funded. This year our student of choice was a graduate of Sedro Woolley High School. Next year's awardee has not been yet. Unit 21's goal was to help a future teacher through the extra expenses that go along with getting that valuable classroom experience.

### Washington State School Retirees' Scholarships

*The Robert J. Handy Scholarship* funded by Pemco Financial Center and Washington School Retirees' Association District NW1. This four year (\$900 per year) scholarship was awarded to Alexandrea White of Anacortes High School, Anacortes, WA.. Alexandrea is interested in working with children with special needs and plans to become a special education teacher.

*The WSSRA Foundation Scho*larship funded by the Foundation and WSSRA District NW1. Taylor Manning of Sedro Woolley High School has earned this one time \$2500 award.
