WSSRA recently did a <u>Health Care (PEBB)</u> <u>webinar</u> featuring Ellen Wolfhagen, the senior account manager for state employee medical coverage. If you missed it, you can go to our *WSSRA.org* website and find and watch the recorded webinar. If you find that you would like to have the power point sheets in your hand, you can email Bruce Boyer and he can send them to you as an attachment to your email request. The long and short of it is that <u>PEBB</u> <u>now has a new medical insurance plan available that is similar to the current Uniform medical op-</u> <u>tion, but a lower premium.</u> You will need to do your own comparisons to determine if you want to change plans before Nov. 30.

Thus I will have more up to date information that I will be able to pass along to you. Mini-Grant Program

Skagit/Island/San Juan Unit 21 is pleased to tell all you faithful members that your dues went to support 28 mini-grant requests that represented six school districts, nine schools and 28 classrooms or programs. Applications were submitted by one superintendent, two principals and one school librarian s well as classroom teachers and paraeducators. The requests ranged from the usual classroom enrichment items/programs to more basic help to offset the unusual circumstances we all find ourselves in during this pandemic. Many requests asked for support for the poorest and neediest of their students such as basic food, clothing, and shelter. It became abundantly clear how needy and at-risk our students are. Many find themselves without permanent (let alone safe) homes. Many are lacking regular meals and depend on their school districts for food. Attendance for the classrooms that are open is sporadic due to some of the personal safety issues the students, and parents, find themselves facing.

All requests were amazing in the strategies that our on-the-job school personnel are improvising and implementing in their attempt to offset the hardships their students are undergoing.

The total requests funded were \$5580.00. Thank you, each and every one, for your contribution to this program.
