Our Board met via ZOOM on August 21 and September 28, where we made plans for this coming year. Some of the upcoming activities will be to:

1. Do a candidate virtual forum for legislative candidates in our area. This will be recorded and available for members to see at our WSSRA.org unit site by early October. A big thanks to Peter Diedrick and Alan Burke for their assistance with setting up and moderating these forums. We are not doing a candidate forum for the 40th legislative district as one position was not contested and the others were huge winners in the primary.
2. Developed a plan to assist local school districts this coming year with our "mini-grants" money. With local districts not starting in buildings, there are new needs for staff and students, which we will try to assist via buildings and/or district funding.
3. Decided that we will host virtual meetings this year with speakers from our area. One of the speakers will be Bill De Hon, a local member talking about issues that affect our finances. We will email you the dates and times for these virtual meetings. In order not to miss out on these meetings, it is important that we have your email address in our unit files. **We do not release** your email address to anyone outside of our unit, including the state WSSRA office. 4. We will continue to make our yearly donation to the Boy's and Girl's Clubs in our area.
5. We will be making our \$1,500 WWU Scholarship contribution to help a senior in education related fields during their quarter of student teaching. This year's recipient is Patrick Kissinger of the Mount Vernon area. He is majoring in social studies.
6. This year, due to Covid-19, there will not be an in person retirement seminar in the spring. Instead, there will be a ZOOM forum held this winter with representatives from the Department of Retirement, Health Benefits, VEBA and others making presentations.
