Hello Members!

I would like to share with you the benefits of your being a member of our local Skagit/Island/San Juan School Retirees' Association and WSSRA.

Locally:

- 1. We hold general membership social and informational meetings. See article about upcoming Feb. 26 meeting.
- 2. This year we distributed \$4,800 in minigrants to current members who are still working in local schools. These fund, \$200 each for current members, \$100 each for non-members, and are being used to purchase additional supplies, fund field trips and to help deal with student behavior/learning issues in their classrooms among other things.
- We award two scholarships yearly. One to a local high school student during their student teaching year at WWU and one to a student at SVC, working towards a trade certificate.
- 4. We donate to the local Boy's and Girl's Clubs who provide activities and help after school to promote academic success. Youth that participate in this program outperform others by being on track to graduate high school, having regular school attendance, and even how far kids think they will get in school. 5. We present workshops in local schools to aide all school employees throughout their career regarding retirement planning.

On the State level:

- We have several members that work with our local legislators to help maintain/improve school retiree benefits.
- 2. State wide his past year, we awarded over \$117,000 in scholarships to high school seniors.
- 3. We are associated with AARP and work with them on senior issues, especially at the national level, i.e.: prescription drug pricing.

One of the major benefits over these recent COVID years has been ZOOM to help keep your board connected to each other and supporting our causes. Washington State School Retirees Report for 2024 Legislative Session

In a short session things move quickly and change in a hurry, for better or worse.

Two of our bills, House Bill 1985 (The Plan 1 one-time 3% COLA) and House Bill 2013 (The Department of Retirement Systems' "Month of Death Bill") had already gotten public hearings and were scheduled for executive action on Thursday, January 25th.

However, at some point before these bills received executive consideration, the word came down to "**trim the budget**". Here's where our bills are today:

House Bill 1985: The Plan 1 Cost of Living Adjustment was amended. The one-time 3% Plan 1 COLA was cut from up to \$125 per month to \$110 per month, making it identical to the COLAs awarded in 2021 and 2023. This won't affect many of us, just some at the higher end of the retirement scale. This could have been much worse! The amended SHB (Substitute House Bill) 1985 received a unanimous vote out of the House Appropriations Committee. Now the bill has passed the House of Representatives and is on to the Senate Ways and Means Committee for action on or after February 14th.

House Bill 2013: The Month of Death
Bill would have allowed a retiree's pension
and his/her PEBB medical premium to be
paid for the full month of his or her death. It
would end the requirement that
the Department of Retirement
Systems contact surviving families to require
reimbursement for the unused portion of the
dead retiree's last pension check.

Instead of receiving executive action last Thursday, House Bill 2013 was killed and the committee substituted a brand new bill, House Bill 2481. This new bill does not even mention the final month's pension payment; it only agrees to pay the retiree's final month's PEBB medical benefit. The month of death phone calls will continue, and survivors will still be told to return the unused pension. HB 2481 is now in the House Rules Committee.

House Bill 2471, sponsored by our friend, **Representative Shelley Kloba,** would have provided .5 additional retirement service credit for Plan 2 and 3 employees

who serve beyond their 30th year. Admittedly, it "dropped" on January 23rd, late in the session, and it has not received a public hearing, We will try to bring it back next session.

House Bill 2188 would have increased

the Medicare Eligible Healthcare Benefit

PEBB Subsidy from 50% of plan cost to 60% of the cost but not more than \$183 per month. It had a public hearing in the House

Appropriations Committee January 15, but was never scheduled for executive action, so it did not survive the February 5th cutoff deadline. Its companion bill Senate Bill 6139, did not even receive a public hearing.

As a reminder of our overall goals for 2024, I again list the WSSRA legislative priorities below:

- Obtain a Plan 1 Cost of Living Adjustment.
- Protect Retiree Medical Benefits.
- Make the actuarially recommended pension payment to the pension funds.
- Support additional payments to the Plan 1 Unfunded Liability.
- Provide Retirees Full Month's Salary/PEBB Benefit through month of death
- Support Plan 2/3 Members by lowering the retirement age and increasing pension benefits.
- We work to achieve these goals by supporting the passage of bills that address them. The members of the WSSRA Legislative Committee meet with as many legislators as they can. Our NW-1 Legislative Committee Members have already met virtually with 18 of them.. Our February appointments will all be in person in Olympia.
